The two home owners' associations of the SaddleBrooke senior community finally have their antenna rules synchronized. Antennas under 12-feet height do not need a permit. Antennas exceeding the 12-feet height can be erected by permit if they do not pose any safety hazard to residents; use the lowest possible height for reception; are placed at the least visible location from the street, golf course, or from neighbors; and they do not adversely affect the present and future aesthetic value of the community. These guidelines could be served as a model for other architectural and landscape restricted communities.

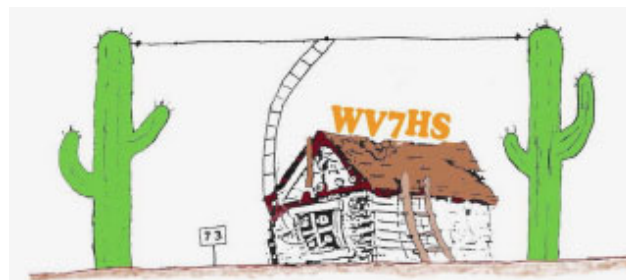
Ron, KG7OH, who lives in a strict HOA, has now logged 180DXCC entities using his hidden antennas. That is quite an

#### Contest Tip This Month – Run versus Search and Pounce.

Running can really increase your QSO totals in contests. Your antenna and power certainly helps, but even antennas at 20 to 40 feet can do a decent job. Running in domestic contests will produce better results if your antennas are marginal. Go higher in the band to stay away from the fast guys and have a better chance of being heard. S&P can also produce decent rates if a band is busy. Clicking on the mult and QSO list can help you work guys quickly if you are assisted. At least try

running if you are not used to doing so. You will also find it helps develop your skill set.

## 50 YEARS AGO, "East Mesa" and AJ By Larry WB7C

In January 1976, when I made Arizona home, my new residence was in the middle of the desert east of the small city of Mesa. Mesa was "over there," pointing west, and Apache Junction was "over there," pointing east. Broadway Road was a two-lane paved road (dirt in 1973). The Superstition Mountains were mostly crystal clear in the clean air.

Half a century ago, the eastern Mesa City Limits were at what is now Power Road. Power Road extended south of Main Street, while Bush Highway extended north of Main Street all the way to Saguaro Lake. And the combined US 60 and US 89, which ran on Main Street, continued east as Apache Trail. US 89 went south over today's State Route 79 from Florence Junction through Florence to Tucson.

From just north of the intersection of University Drive and Bush Highway, Usery Pass Road went northeast to McKellips Road, west of Ellsworth Road. Ahead, across McKellips, stood the remnants of an abandoned road. Usery Pass Road had been realigned with Ellsworth Road at McKellips. Years later, this stretch of Usery Pass back to Bush Highway was also abolished.

In the late '70s, no fully-grown trees existed in any quantity; therefore, distant storms could light up the sky with no thunder heard. By way of example, we could aim the television antenna at the tower lights on South Mountain, Phoenix, 27 miles away. Lightning could be seen for at least that distance, and then some.

The weather was much wetter, and a thunderclap could race across the desert from the Goldfield Mountains to the San Tan Mountains, 15 miles away, and back again. The wet desert floor did not absorb sound as dry ground would.

I experienced such a thunderclap. I was sitting, reading the newspaper in the room's ambient light, facing the big windows on the mobile home's northwest side.

BRILLIANT flash of lightning. I tensed up expecting a crash of thunder, but there was none. I went back to reading.

BOOM! Rumble, rumble, rumble, rumble, rumble, BOOM! The thunder rumbled for several minutes more.

Nowadays at that location, the Superstition Freeway lies a mile south, the Super-Red-Tan interchange is nearby, and the Red Mountain 202 freeway is about a mile west. With noise walls and the constant rush sound of tires on pavement, thunder will not be free to roll across the vacant desert floor anymore.

Our weather is warmer and drier than it was 50 years ago. Citrus groves are now replaced with homes and more pavement. We don't see smudge pots keeping the frost off the orchards anymore.

Back in 1971, Holly Lake reached 40 degrees BELOW ZERO, and Phoenix was at 19 degrees. Mesa was at 15.

Rural Mesa is no more and the weather has warmed up in this area. Apache Junction incorporated as a city in 1978, and over

the years, the cities of Mesa and Apache Junction have virtually merged.

I thought you might enjoy this look back in history.

#### Greens Peak

In October the tech committee began investigating a power issue at the site for the generator not starting. Weather permitted a visit on Jan 7th to investigate alarms related to low battery voltage. Cole, AA7RD and Dennis AE7WU traveled to Greens Peak to investigate. They determined the transfer panel was not passing commercial power to the site. They bypassed the transfer panel and replaced the battery charger for the site. After monitoring the power stability the site was restored to operation on Jan 11th. The tech committee is determining next steps for replacement / repair of the transfer panel and generator for this site.

#### White Tanks

After extensive work to diagnose the 50-year-old generator malfunction the ARA board voted to replace the generator and transfer panel for White Tanks. This site continues to have a backup battery and charger. A new generator and transfer switch was purchased to replace the old generator. Work is in progress for planning the removal of the old generator / transfer panel, designing a new frame for the new generator,

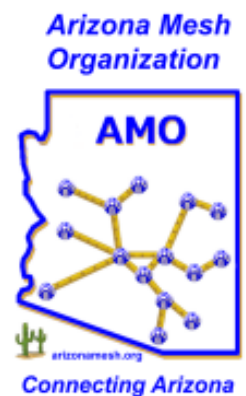
